## Watch out for 'hidden' plastic

Any single-use product that is made entirely or partially of plastic is prohibited at events.
Example: In most trays for French fries and paper cups, there is a thin layer of plastic. $\rightarrow$ not authorized


## Special case: beverage cans and cartons

Beverage cans and cartons are allowed until January 1, 2025.
After that date, they will be banned from public events.


## From now on, let's favour multiple-use

In view of the banning of most single-use products in 2025, it is strongly advised that all public event organizers look for reusable solutions right away. In particular, it is recommended to inquire about options for sharing and renting reusable dishes.

This document describes the national legal framework. Some municipalities may, at their level, have already banned all single use in 2023. Find out from your municipality.
